Call Notes for first 30-minute call with client

In the first 30-minute call, the client will be asked the following questions. Below each question are sample notes from a hypothetical call with Omar Farid, the fictional client.

What first drew you to study Psychology? Can you tell me about your experiences so far?

Omar has always been interested in people and 'what makes them tick.' He has recently completed an MSc in Cognitive Psychology at the University of Edinburgh and, previously, completed a BSc in Psychology at the University of Manchester. He is particularly interested in the experiences of clients from marginalised communities and wants this to be a major part of his research. He enjoys combining research methods with people and is a 'hands on' researcher.

What are your research interests?

Omar needs funding to pay for his fees. He may be able to start the PhD without it, as he has a full time job so doesn't need funding to cover his living expenses.
